What Do the ACT and the SAT Tests Measure?


- In general, the ACT and the SAT tests attempt to measure college readiness and predict future academic success. But they do so in very different ways:
- The ACT test measures what a student already knows. It covers material that the student should have learned during high school.
- The SAT test is used more as a predictor of what a student is capable of learning. It deals with material that the student may NOT have learned in high school.
- For this reason, some students do better on the ACT test—especially if they tend to struggle with standardized tests—and other students do better on the SAT test.
- Most colleges accept either test score, so many students take both exams to improve their chances of being admitted.

Accuplacer -TCL Entrance Exam

The primary advantage of the Early College model is:

- The opportunity for students to complete two years of college while in high school.
- Students can earn a college credential in the form of a certificate or degree while also earning their standard high school diploma.
- WBECHS students have the option to take college-level classes on both the WBECHS and TCL campuses.

Accuplacer continues

- Students must take an Accuplacer entrance exam and achieve an acceptable score on the TCL exam before they are allowed to enroll.
- Accuplacer Test is a computerized test that helps high schools and colleges evaluate skills and place students into appropriate courses.
- Accuplacer Test offers tests in reading, math and language/writing essay.
- Test results are received immediately upon completion of testing.

All ACCUPLACER tests use a multiple-choice format. There's no time limit on the tests, so you can focus on doing your best to demonstrate your skills.

ACCUPLACER uses the latest computer-adaptive technology and the questions you see are based on your skill level. Your response to each question drives the difficulty level of the next question so it's important to give each question as much thought as you can before selecting your answer.

The number of questions varies depending on which ACCUPLACER tests you take. There could be as few as 12 questions or as many as 40.

No one passes or fails ACCUPLACER tests, but it's important to complete the test using your best effort, so you and your college have an accurate measure of your academic skills."

ARMED SERVICES VOCATIONAL APTITUDE BATTERY TEST

ASVAB



The **ASVAB** (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery Test) is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military or other career paths. It is a way of indicating whether or not an individual is well qualified to serve.



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The ASVAB also provides students with career exploration scores which can help you determine your readiness for further education and training in different career areas, not just the military.

Air Force - The minimum ASVAB score is 36. In actual practice, though, more than 70% of those accepted for enlistment score a 50 or higher. **Army -** The minimum ASVAB score is 31. **Coast Guard -** The minimum score to enter the Coast Guard is 50. Navy - As a general rule, the minimum ASVAB score is 35.

Marine Corps - The minimum ASVAB score is 31.

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
